

STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW

The College must determine the completion/graduation rate of its diploma- or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students; transfer out, retention, and placement rates.

COMPLETION/GRADUATION AND OUTCOME MEASURE RATES

Each year the College determines the completion/graduation rate of its certificate- or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students and reports it to the Department of Education via the Integrated Postsecondary Educational Data System (IPEDS) website.

The annual rates are based on the 12-month period that ended August 31 of the prior year. The rates will track the outcomes for students for whom 150% of the normal time for completion or graduation has elapsed. Normal time is the amount of time necessary for a student to complete all requirements for a degree or certificate according to the College's catalog. This is typically four years for a bachelor degree in a standard term-based institution, two years for an associate degree in a standard term-based institution, and the various scheduled times for certificate programs.

The 2011-2012 Fall cohort (new students starting in the Fall 2011 term) is utilized to determine the completion/graduation rate for the 2017-2018 year. The **completion/graduation** rate includes only first-time, full-time, undergraduate, degree seeking students who completed their program within 150% of the time allowed. Midstate College's completion/graduation rate for its degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students is at 0% (there was one student in this category.) The College's overall rate of completion/graduation rate was 20%. The four-year average Student-Right-to-Know Completion/Graduation rate is 28%.

The **Outcome Measures** for degree-seeking undergraduates is as follows for the July 1, 2009 - June 30, 2010 Cohort:

TRANSFER RATE

The Transfer-out Rate for the 2011 Fall Cohort of full-time, first-time, degree seeking, entering students that subsequently transferred out was 0% overall. The four-year average Student-Right-to-Know Transfer Out rate is 6%.

RETENTION RATE

The following information is determined from the Fall 2017 IPEDS Enrollment Data. The Department of Education requires institutions to report retention figures for the full-time, first time, bachelor students from the Fall 2016 class that were still enrolled as of Fall 2017. The retention rate includes only first-time, degree seeking bachelor students. Midstate College's retention rate for its degree-seeking, first-time, full-time bachelor students is 0% (there were no students in this category). The College's retention rate for associate and diploma students in the full-time category is 50% (there were two students in this category).
